


BASIC OCCUPATIONAL FIRST AID (BOFA)

This program is designed to train laypersons to become qualified first aiders in accordance with ACT 514 regulations. Participants will learn essential life support skills, including CPR, handling choking incidents, managing bleeding, treating wounds, burns, scalds, and fractures. The program includes theoretical presentations, practical sessions, and lifelike simulations with casualty makeup to equip participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to handle emergencies.

By the end of the training, participants will be able to:

- Understand first aid principles and regulations
- Perform CPR and manage choking incidents
- Treat cuts, burns, fractures, and other injuries
- Conduct physical assessments
- Use first aid equipment effectively
- Apply best practices in medical treatment
- Communicate and collaborate during emergencies








